The Parliament of Queensland enacts—

1 Short title

This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation (Parliament) Act* 2015.

2 Appropriation for 2015–2016

- The Treasurer is authorised to pay \$87,274,000 from the consolidated fund for the Legislative Assembly and parliamentary service for the financial year starting 1 July 2015.
- (2) The amount mentioned in subsection (1) is appropriated for 15 the financial year for the Legislative Assembly and 16 parliamentary service for application to its departmental 17 services, equity adjustment and administered items as stated 18 in schedule 1.
- (3) The amount mentioned in subsection (1) includes the amount 20 already authorised by the *Appropriation (Parliament) Act* 21 2014, section 3, to be paid for the financial year starting 1 July 2015.
