Mate, I think Stuey has raised this with you before but given the recent developments, I want to raise it again.

We have some contractors at ENERGEX that aren't paying the correct rate to their employees. We renegotiated a long established clause in the current EBA that ensures that contractors staff, on balance, are not paid less than in house staff, the history of this clause goes back to the Use of Contractors Industrial Agreement 1991, negotiated between the ETU and the then SEQEB, under the Goss Government, to finally settle the SEQEB dispute.

ENERGEX's IR team has engaged Barristers to give advice that the clause isn't enforceable and have further gone to Ergon and Powerlink advocating that they back the ENERGEX position.

The brains trust, [redacted] Schedule 4 CTPI have plenty of anti Union/anti worker form about them, this is just their latest attack. During negotiations under NEWMAN, we caught [redacted] Schedule 4 CTPI hiding behind a tree filming us meeting with Delegates in a coffee shop, they are the lowest of the low.

Want you to be aware of this eh, it has massive industrial ramifications if not resolved, at our ESI Conference this week I will be calling for a resolution to undertake an industrial campaign on this issue.
