Biosecurity Matter (cl.15)

Contaminant (cl.18)

Anything that may be harmful to animal or plant health or pose a risk to a biosecurity consideration



Carriers (cl.17) a thing, alive, dead or inanimate (includes a human) capable of moving or containing biosecurity matter

Biosecurity risk (cl.16) is a possibility of these things having an adverse effect on a biosecurity consideration
