1 Finance and Administration Committee

The Finance and Administration Committee (the Committee) was established on 27 March 2015 as a portfolio committee of the Queensland Legislative Assembly.

Section 92 of the *Parliament of Queensland Act 2001* outlines the main responsibilities of a portfolio committee. In relation to its portfolio area, a committee may—

- consider Appropriation Bills;
- consider other legislation and proposed legislation; and
- perform its role in relation to public accounts and public works.

Schedule 6 of the *Standing Rules and Orders of the Legislative Assembly* sets out the Committee's portfolio responsibilities as follows:

- Premier, Cabinet and the Arts; and
- Treasury, Employment, Industrial Relations, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships.

The Committee also has oversight responsibilities for:

- Auditor-General;
- Integrity Commissioner;
- Family Responsibilities Commission; and
- Queensland Family and Child Commission.

2 Annual report

In accordance with section 108 of the *Parliament of Queensland Act 2001*, the Committee is required to table an annual report within four months and 14 days after the end of each financial year. The report must include:

- a list of meetings of the Committee and the names of members attending or absent from each meeting;
- a summary of issues considered by the Committee, including a description of the more significant issues arising from the considerations;
- a statement of the Committee's revenue and spending for the year; and
- a brief description of responses by Ministers to recommendations of the Committee.

This report provides a summary of the activities of the Committee from 27 March to 30 June 2015.

3 Inquiries and reports

The Committee considered a number of issues and tabled four reports during the 2014-2015 financial year. The Committee's reports and inquiries are discussed below.

3.1 Bills and subordinate legislation

The Committee examined a number of bills and pieces of subordinate legislation in accordance with its responsibility under section 93(1) of the *Parliament of Queensland Act 2001*, in particular the Committee considered:

- the policy to be given effect by the legislation;
- the application of fundamental legislative principles to the legislation, and
- for subordinate legislation its lawfulness.

3.2.1 Portfolio subordinate legislation tabled between 29 August 2014 and 26 March 2015 (Report No. 1)

On 7 May 2015, the Committee tabled Report No. 1: Portfolio subordinate legislation tabled between 29 August 2014 and 26 March 2015.

The Committee did not identify any significant policy issues or issues relating to fundamental legislative.

3.2.2 Parliament of Queensland and Other Acts Amendment Bill 2015 (Report No. 2)

On 27 March 2015, the *Parliament of Queensland and Other Acts Amendment Bill 2015* was referred to the Committee for examination and report. The Committee's consideration of the Bill included calling for public submissions, a public departmental briefing, held on 10 April 2015 and a public hearing, held on 27 April 2015. The Committee received five submissions.

The Committee tabled its report on 8 May 2015. The Committee was unable to reach agreement on whether to recommend that the Bill be passed. The government Members accepted the Bill should pass with amendments. The non-government Members considered that additional amendments would be required before they could support the Bill. The Committee reached consensus agreement on two recommendations.

The Minister tabled the government response on 20 May 2015 accepting both recommendations. The Bill was passed, with amendments, on 20 May 2015.

3.2.3 Payroll Tax Rebate, Revenue and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2015 (Report No. 3a)

On 27 March 2015, the Treasurer, Minister for Employment and Industrial Relations and Minister for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships introduced the *Payroll Tax Rebate, Revenue and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2015* which was referred to the Committee for examination and report. The Committee's consideration of the Bill included calling for public submissions, a public and a private departmental briefing and a public hearing. The Committee also received additional written responses from the department and stakeholders. The Committee received 18 submissions.

The Committee tabled its report on 25 May 2015. The Committee was unable to reach agreement on whether to recommend that the Bill be passed. The government Members accepted the Bill should pass with amendments. The non-government Members considered that additional amendments would be required before they could support the Bill. The Committee reached consensus agreement on five recommendations.

The Minister tabled the government response on 2 July 2015. The government accepted all recommendations. The Bill was passed, with amendments, on 2 July 2015.

3.2.4 Industrial Relations (Restoring Fairness) and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2015 (Report No. 4)

On 7 May 2015, the Treasurer, Minister for Employment and Industrial Relations and Minister for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships introduced the *Industrial Relations (Restoring Fairness) and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2015* which was referred to the Committee for examination and report. The Committee's consideration of the Bill included calling for public submissions, a public departmental briefing, held on 20 May 2015 and five public hearings, held on 25 May 2015. The Committee received 1,040 submissions.

The Committee tabled its report on 1 June 2015. The Committee was unable to reach agreement on whether to recommend that the Bill be passed. The government Members accepted the Bill should pass with amendments. The non-government Members considered that significant amendments would be required before they could support the Bill. The Committee reached consensus agreement on two recommendations.

The government response was tabled on 4 June 2015. The government accepted one recommendation and did not accept one recommendation. The Bill was passed, with amendments, on 2 June 2015.

4 Committee expenditure

The Committee had no revenue during 2014-15. The Committee is funded from the appropriation made to the Legislative Assembly. The expenditure of the Committee from 27 March to 30 June 2015 is shown in the table below.
