Question on Notice No. 270 Asked on 28 February 2008

MR SPRINGBORG asked the Minister for Health (MR ROBERTSON)-

QUESTION:

- (1) Will he provide a detailed breakdown of capital investment expenditure for 2006-07, 2005-06 and 2004-05, providing details for each year of the (a) number of aged care beds provided, (b) location, (c) project expense and (d) project timeline?
- (2) In relation to the difference of value in investment between 2006-07 and 2005-06, will he provide a detailed explanation for the drop in expenditure?

ANSWER:

(1) Since the announcement of our 2001 Election Commitment to upgrade the State's Residential Aged Care Facilities to meet the certification and accreditation standards required by the Australian Government, Queensland Health has been in the process of replacing a number of the State's aged care facilities and upgrading resident comfort through the installation of air-conditioning in an additional three of our residential aged care facilities, Oakey at \$293,668, Zillmere at \$470,954 and Hervey Bay at \$164,076 (since transferred to the private sector).

A breakdown of the capital investment expenditure for the three years follows:

The further detail you requested in (a) to (d) of your question is attached.

(2) The Aged Care Capital Works Program (2001-2006) provided for the roll out of a program of works over a period of five years which commenced in July 2001. Cashflow variances of capital expenditure over time are reflective of the delivery timeframes for the various projects with the program of works.

The majority of the capital projects within the program of works were completed within the five year period, with planning and construction delays experienced at Wondai, and completed in April 2007, and delays regarding the appropriate options for replacement of the Nambour facility.

The replacement of the Hibiscus House, Nambour, was put on hold whilst extensive site and soil investigations were undertaken, and a site master plan for the Nambour Hospital was completed. A new Greenfield site for the replacement of Hibiscus House has been selected and purchased. I am advised that all project documentation has been completed and is ready to go to tender, as soon as our Development Application has been approved by the local council, which I anticipate in the near future.
