And calls on both the government and the LNP in government to change environmental policy to reflect best practice not standard practice with regard to the independent testing of millions of cubic metres of possibly poisonous toxic dredge soil before it is dumped in an area which is in close proximity to the coral of the Great Barrier Reef.
