***An Act to amend the *Disaster Management Regulation 2014*, the *Police Powers and Responsibilities Act 2000*, the *Police Service Administration Act 1990*, the *Police Service Administration Regulation 2016*, the *Public Safety Business Agency Act 2014*, the *Public Service Act 2008*, the *State Buildings Protective Security Act 1983*, the *State Buildings Protective Security Regulation 2008* and the *Working with Children (Risk Management and Screening) Act 2000* for particular purposes***
