## Introduction

The Nature Conservation Act 1992 (NC Act) provides a legislative basis for the conservation of nature.

The NC Act aims to achieve the conservation of nature while allowing for the involvement of First Nations peoples in the management of protected areas, through an integrated and comprehensive conservation strategy for the whole of the State. It provides the framework for research; community education; dedicating, declaring, and managing protected areas; and protecting native wildlife and its habitat.

The NC Act also provides for the making of subordinate legislation including regulations, notices, and conservation plans.

Under section 139 of the NC Act, the chief executive must, within four months after the end of each financial year, give to the Minister a report on the administration of the NC Act during the year. The Minister must lay a copy of the report before the Legislative Assembly within 14 sitting days after its receipt by the Minister.

## **Queensland's Biodiversity Strategy**

In accordance with section 5 of the *Nature Conservation Act 1992*, the conservation of nature in Queensland is achieved through a comprehensive and integrated whole of State conservation strategy.

Conserving Nature – a Biodiversity Strategy for Queensland (the Strategy) was published in October 2022. The Strategy outlines the Queensland Government's commitment and approach to conserving the State's biodiversity values, and acts as a coordinating framework for strategies, programs and initiatives that contribute to biodiversity conservation in Queensland.

The Strategy contains four goals to Protect, Restore and Recover, Adapt and Connect. Implementation of the Strategy is underway, with key highlights from the Department of Environment, Science and Innovation's programs in 2023-24 including:

- Goal 1 Protect: Queensland's biodiversity is protected and well managed Increasing Queensland's protected area system by over 377,334 hectares in 2023-24, demonstrating Queensland's contribution to the national 30 by 30 target.
- Goal 2 Restore and Recover: Queensland's biodiversity is restored and rehabilitated to reinstate
  ecosystem function and recover species populations
  Investing significantly to scale up the restoration of ecosystems, including funding 20 carbon projects under the
  Land Restoration Fund from 2019-2024 that will incentivise restoration or protection of over 13,000 hectares of
  unregulated native vegetation.
- Goal 3 Adapt: Queensland's biodiversity is supported to adapt to changing environment
   Supporting the conservation and recovery of native species through administrating research and community
   grants programs, as well as boosting efforts to conserve koalas and their habitats by significantly extending
   and expanding actions under South East Queensland Koala Conservation Strategy.
- Goal 4 Connect: People value biodiversity, including its contribution to their wellbeing, and are motivated to protect it
   Improving visitor experiences and revitalising infrastructure on our national parks, supporting peoples

connectedness to nature.

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019* (HR Act), respective subordinate legislation under the NC Act includes a human rights certificate that is compatible with the human rights protected by the HR Act (where relevant) and is published on the Queensland legislation website.

## Nature Conservation Act 1992—departmental administrative responsibilities

During the reporting period, the NC Act was administered consistent with Administrative Arrangements Order (No.1) 2023 and Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 2) 2023.

As at 30 June 2024, the Department of Environment, Science and Innovation (DESI) is responsible for:

- the dedication and declaration of protected areas (including nature refuges)
- custody and management of the protected area estate and forest reserves
- protection of native wildlife and its habitats and listing the conservation status of native wildlife
- providing for the ecologically sustainable use of protected wildlife
- supporting the management of nature refuges and special wildlife reserves by their owners.

## Nature Conservation (Estuarine Crocodile) Conservation Plan 2018

The Nature Conservation (Estuarine Crocodile) Conservation Plan 2018 establishes the legislative approach for the conservation of crocodiles, the management of 'problem' crocodiles and the ecologically sustainable and humane take, keep and use of estuarine crocodiles including the sustainable harvest of estuarine crocodile eggs. The purpose of the plan is to ensure the conservation of estuarine crocodile in the wild, minimise public safety risks, prevent losses in the aquaculture industries from problem crocodiles, and ensure any commercial use of estuarine crocodiles is sustainable.

The Plan was not amended in 2023-24.

## **Nature Conservation (Forest Reserves) Regulation 2000**

The Nature Conservation (Forest Reserves) Regulation 2000 contains a schedule listing the names and descriptions of former *Land Act 1994* reserves, State forests, timber reserves and unallocated state land now declared as a forest reserve under the NC Act.

### **Protected areas**

The protected area classes, as stated in section 14 of the NC Act, are:

- national parks (scientific)
- national parks
- national parks (Aboriginal land)
- national parks (Torres Strait Islander land)
- national parks (Cape York Peninsula Aboriginal land (CYPAL))
- conservation parks
- resources reserves
- special wildlife reserves
- nature refuges
- coordinated conservation areas.

All classes of national parks are areas with outstanding natural and cultural values and represent the highest level of protection under the NC Act. National parks (scientific) also contain exceptional scientific values and are managed to ensure the processes of nature continue unaffected in these areas and protect the areas' biological diversity to the greatest possible extent while allowing controlled scientific study and some manipulation of habitat to manage threatened wildlife and control threatening processes. National parks are managed to permanently preserve and protect their natural and cultural values and provide educational and recreational opportunities, while ensuring that any uses are nature-based and ecologically sustainable. There are currently no national parks (Torres Strait Islander land), but these areas are intended to represent areas that should also be managed in accordance with Island custom or activities in the area. National parks (Aboriginal land) and National parks (CYPAL) are also to be managed in accordance with any Aboriginal tradition or activities relating to the area.

Conservation parks are generally smaller than national parks and their conservation values may not be as significant. Conservation parks are managed to permanently conserve and present the area's natural and cultural values to the greatest possible extent, as well as to provide educational, recreational, and commercial opportunities in a way that is consistent with these values and is sustainable.

Resources reserves allow for the controlled use of the area's natural and cultural values such as mining and quarrying but must be managed to ensure the area is maintained predominantly in its natural condition.

Special wildlife reserves are a voluntary, binding, and perpetual class of protected area, for application on privately owned land that contains exceptional natural and cultural resources and values. They can apply to freehold, leasehold, and reserve tenures, with ownership and management responsibilities remaining unaffected. Special wildlife reserves are afforded protections from incompatible land uses like those afforded to national parks.

Nature refuges are areas of high conservation significance generally owned by private individuals and companies, which are predominantly negotiated through a legally binding, perpetual agreement between the landholder and the State. They are managed to conserve the area's significant natural and cultural resources and to provide for its controlled use as well as the interests of the landholder.

There are two coordinated conservation areas that overlay multiple tenure types, which are managed in a coordinated manner by the various landholders. They are managed to conserve the area's natural and cultural values and to provide for the interests of the landholders.

Table A details the status of classes of protected areas, including changes during 2023–24.

#### Special management areas (SMAs) controlled action

Under the NC Act, SMAs (controlled action) can be declared under section 42A by the chief executive over a national park or part of a national park to allow special management actions to occur.

A SMA (controlled action) allows for either the manipulation of an area's natural and cultural resources to protect or restore the area's natural or cultural values, or, the continuation of a lawful existing use, where the use is consistent with maintaining the area's natural and cultural values. A SMA (controlled action) is designed to facilitate activities that would otherwise be inconsistent with the management principles on national parks.

As at 30 June 2024, the total area of national parks subject to SMAs (controlled action) was approximately 51,745 hectares. No new SMAs (controlled action) were declared in 2023–24.

In the 2023–24 reporting period, existing SMAs (controlled action) were active in:

- D'Aguilar, Mapleton and Conway National Parks to allow continuation of a lawful existing use in foliage harvesting until 2024.
- Mooloolah River National Park to allow continuation of a lawful existing use in beekeeping until 2024.
- Mazeppa and Nairana National Parks to allow controlled stock grazing to manage high fuel loads associated with buffel grass to reduce threats to endangered fire sensitive communities.
- Mount Coolum National Park to allow controlled vegetation management, including targeted removal of native Melaleuca quinquenervia may be allowed in this area to restore ground parrot habitat (heathland), subject to ongoing monitoring.

#### Protected area authorities

Sections 34–38, 42AD–42AEA, 42AN–42AP and 43F–43H of the NC Act deal with the granting of authorities for the use of national parks, national parks (CYPAL), Indigenous joint management areas, conservation parks, resources reserves and special wildlife reserves. Sections 37 and 38 include provision for leases issued under the *Land Act 1994* and continuing authorities under the repealed *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1975*.

Under these provisions, leases and authorities can, in specific circumstances, be issued for purposes that include but are not limited to ecotourism, communications, electricity infrastructure, water extraction and grazing.

The Nature Conservation (Protected Areas Management) Regulation 2017 provides for activities to be undertaken on protected areas by permit, authority or agreement (approvals) and outlines the administrative matters relating to the grant, amendment, suspension, cancellation, surrender and replacement of the relevant approvals. The Regulation outlines additional requirements and restrictions that apply to certain activities and approvals on protected areas.

Nine authorities under the *Nature Conservation Act 1992*, 536 authorities under the Nature Conservation (Protected Areas Management) Regulation 2017, 28 commercial activity agreements, plus 193,400 protected area camping permits were issued during the reporting period. A summary of information relating to protected area authorities during 2023–24 is provided in Table B.

There were 6 internal reviews of decisions and 4 appeals to the Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal made during 2023–24. A summary of the internal reviews and appeals of protected area authority decisions during 2023–24 is provided in Table C.

Additional information relating to the administration of selected camping permits, and commercial activity agreements and permits in 2023–24 is provided in Table D.

Under section 54 of the NC Act the chief executive may, before the interest is created, require a person seeking an interest in land in a protected area to give the chief executive an environmental impact statement (EIS) for the use, or a stated use, of the land under the interest. No EISs were required or considered under this provision during 2023–24.

Under section 174A of the NC Act the chief executive may, by gazette notice, approve or make codes of practice for protected areas or forest reserves. No codes of practice under the NC Act for protected areas and forest reserves were current during 2023–24.

#### **Trustees**

Section 31 of the NC Act provides that a conservation park or resources reserve may be placed under the management of trustees. Trustees are listed in Schedule 1 and Schedule 2 of the Nature Conservation (Protected Areas Management) Regulation 2017. There were no new trustees appointed during 2023–24.

#### Commercial activity agreements

The Nature Conservation (Protected Areas Management) Regulation 2017 provides for authorised activities to be allowed on protected areas. Part 8 of the Regulation outlines the process for consideration of commercial activity agreements on protected areas. The 97 commercial activity agreements in force during 2023–24 are listed in Table E. Of these 97 agreements, 90 were current as at 30 June 2024.

## Conservation agreements for private protected areas (nature refuges and special wildlife reserves)

Sections 43B and 45 of the NC Act, under certain circumstances, requires the Minister, for the State, to enter into conservation agreements with private landholders to assist in the conservation of land and wildlife. Sections 43E and 48 of the NC Act allows the Minister, for the State, and the landholders bound by a conservation agreement to amend, vary or replace an existing conservation agreement. The 18 conservation agreements (for private protected areas) executed during 2023–24 are listed in Table F.

#### **Forest reserves**

The NC Act provides for the continued management of lands dedicated as forest reserves prior to their intended transfer to protected area. Changes to the status of forest reserves during 2023–24 are detailed in Table G.

## Management statements and management plans

Sections 111–119B of the NC Act outline the process for preparing management statements and management plans for protected areas. A management statement is generally required for all protected areas. However, a management plan may be prepared instead of a management statement, or to replace an existing management statement, if the Minister is satisfied it is appropriate in the circumstances.

As at 30 June 2024, there were 81 management plans covering 122 protected areas, as listed in Table H—including four national parks (scientific), 65 national parks, two national parks (CYPAL), one national park (Aboriginal Land), 36 conservation parks and 14 resources reserves. During 2023–24 one protected area management plan for Narrien Range National Park underwent an administrative review and extension.

As at 30 June 2024, there are 375 protected area management statements covering 447 protected areas, as listed in Table I—including 4 national parks (scientific), 206 national parks, 20 national parks (CYPAL), 191 conservation parks and 26 resources reserves. During 2023–24, 1 new protected area management statement covering 5 protected areas (Bolger Bay Conservation Park, Horseshoe Bay Lagoon Conservation Park, Magnetic Island Conservation Park 2 and Magnetic Island National Park) was approved (Magnetic Island (Yunbenun) Management Statement 2023), and 189 management statements covering 241 protected areas underwent an administrative review and extension.

As at 30 June 2024, 97.9% (279 of 285) of national parks—including national parks (scientific), 94.6% (227 of 240) of conservation parks and 91% (40 of 44) of resources reserves had a management instrument (management statement or management plan) in place (excluding joint management areas). This enables improved management, including ecosystem health, fire, pest and visitor management, and provided direction on emerging and contemporary matters.

#### Wildlife and habitat conservation

#### Classes of wildlife

Part 5 of the NC Act, the Nature Conservation (Animals) Regulation 2020 and the Nature Conservation (Plants) Regulation 2020 detail the requirements to protect native wildlife. Protected wildlife may be prescribed as 'extinct', 'extinct in the wild', 'critically endangered', 'endangered', 'vulnerable', 'near threatened' or 'least concern'. In addition, wildlife may be prescribed as 'international' or 'prohibited'. There were no changes to the classes of wildlife in 2023–24. A summary of numbers of prescribed wildlife, as at 30 June 2024, is provided in Table J.

### Wildlife licences, permits and other authorities

Under the NC Act, licences, permits or other authorities are required for the 'take', 'keep' and 'use' of protected wildlife, to ensure that use is ecologically sustainable and wild populations are protected. Summaries of information relating to wildlife licences and wildlife permits are provided in Table K and Table L.

Under section 174A of the NC Act, the chief executive may, by gazette notice, approve or make codes of practice for protected wildlife. A summary of the 15 wildlife codes of practice and guidelines in effect under the NC Act during 2023–24 is provided in Table M.

Under section 100B of the NC Act, the Minister may enter into a captive breeding agreement for protected wildlife. A summary of the 4 captive breeding agreements in effect during 2023–24 is provided in Table N.

## Critical habitats and areas of major interest

Under section 175 (2) of the NC Act, the Governor in Council may make regulations with respect to the use or development of land, and activities, in an area identified as, or including, a critical habitat or an area of major interest. No critical habitats or areas of major interest were determined during 2023–24.

#### **Declarations**

Chapter 6, Part 2 of the Nature Conservation (Animals) Regulation 2020 provides for special management declarations for marine mammals. No special management declarations were made during 2023–24.

## Interim conservation orders

Part 6 of the NC Act allows for interim conservation orders to be made for the conservation, protection or management of threatened or near threatened wildlife, a critical habitat, an area of major interest, or a protected area. No interim conservation orders were issued during 2023–24.

#### **Administration**

#### **Conservation officers**

Under section 127 of the NC Act, the responsible Minister may appoint an employee of the department, an officer of the public service, a police officer, or another appropriately qualified person to be a conservation officer. Conservation officers possess a range of investigation, compliance and enforcement powers supporting the implementation of the objectives of the NC Act. Departmental records indicate 35 conservation officers were newly appointed or reappointed under the NC Act during 2023–24. Twenty-four Indigenous Land and Sea Rangers (non-public service employees) were newly authorised to exercise powers under section 151 of the NC Act (Conservation officer may require name and address).

#### Offences and prosecutions

Enforcement of the NC Act is a major activity for DESI to ensure the protection and conservation of Queensland's natural environment.

DESI's Litigation Unit finalised three prosecutions in 2023–24 with convictions by a court, resulting in \$154,200 of fines and other orders and \$6,659.28 of costs. Additional information on enforcement activities for protected area and wildlife matters is provided in Table O.
