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## Minister's Preface

In Queensland, the *Right to Information Act 2009* (RTI) and the *Information Privacy Act 2009* (IP) (the Acts) play a vital role in the government's commitment to make information available to members of the community, while promoting accountability and the appropriate handling of individuals' personal information.

This report provides statistical information about the operation of the Acts across all government agencies (Ministers, Assistant Ministers, Queensland government departments, local councils, universities, hospital and health services, and statutory authorities) during the 2022–23 financial year.

During 2022–23 a total of 16,883 RTI and IP applications were received, almost equivalent to the previous year's figure of 16,979. This indicates an ongoing interest in and use of information provisions by Queenslanders.

Government agencies considered a total of 3,609,979 pages, with 3,011,041 being released either in full or in part, in response to access and amendment applications. This is consistent with past annual patterns of growth prior to and after the record spike of 2020-21.

This is the second time the number of pages considered in RTI and IP requests has exceeded 3.6 million which highlights the ongoing growth and transparency of the right to information processes.

During this period, agencies continued to raise awareness in the public sector and the broader community around the importance and availability of the Acts. Promotion was also undertaken through International Access to Information Day 2022 and Privacy Awareness Week 2023 – highlighting the importance of artificial intelligence and e-governance to improve people's access to information and reaffirming good privacy practices.

I would like to thank RTI and IP officers and relevant agency staff for taking the time to consider information requests in an appropriate and professional manner.

I am pleased to table and present this report to Parliament.

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## Overview

This annual report covers the 2022-23 financial year regarding the operation of the *Right to Information Act 2009* (RTI Act) and the *Information Privacy Act 2009* (IP Act).

The primary object of the RTI Act is to give a right of access to information in the government's possession or under the government's control unless, on balance, it is contrary to the public interest to give the access.

The IP Act works in parallel with the RTI Act and provides for the fair collection and handling of personal information by Queensland Government agencies and a right of access to, and amendment of, personal information in the government's possession or under the government's control unless, on balance, it is contrary to the public interest.

The IP Act sets out 11 Information Privacy Principles (IPPs) with which all agencies must adhere, except for Queensland Health and the Hospital and Health Services (HHSs), which are subject to the National Privacy Principles (NPPs). The IPPs and NPPs govern how Queensland Government agencies collect, store, use and disclose personal information.

## Releasing government information

The process of routinely releasing government information to the public is commonly referred to as the "push" model. Under this model, information is released administratively via mechanisms which include agencies' [publication schemes](#) and [disclosure logs](#). As a result, access applications for information under the legislation are provided as a mechanism of last resort.

## Furthering the objects of the Acts

In the 2022-23 reporting period, State Government agencies made efforts to further the objects of the RTI Act and the IP Act. This information is summarised in [Appendix 25](#).

## Reporting requirements

### Legislative basis

Section 185 of the RTI Act and section 194 of the IP Act require statistical and other information to be collected from Ministers and agencies. Each requirement is outlined as follows:

- section 185(1) of the RTI Act and section 194(1) of the IP Act require the Attorney-General and Minister for Justice and Minister for the Prevention of Domestic and Family Violence to prepare a report and table it in Parliament;
- section 185(2) of the RTI Act and section 194(2) of the IP Act refer to the *Right to Information Regulation 2009* (RTI Regulation) and the *Information Privacy Regulation 2009* (IP Regulation) which set out the details of the information required to be included in the report (refer to [Addendum 1](#)); and
- section 194(3) of the IP Act provides that an annual report under this section may be included as part of an annual report the Minister is required to give under the RTI Act.

## Summary of data

This report includes statistics for both the RTI Act and IP Act for the period 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023.

Data from all Ministers and agencies covered by the RTI Act and the IP Act was collected and collated by Right to Information and Privacy, Department of Justice and Attorney-General (DJAG) for inclusion in this report.

The detailed data for Ministers and agencies is set out in Appendices 1 - 24 of this report and includes information required under:

- section 8(a) - (g) and (j) of the RTI Regulation; and
- section 6(a) - (g) and (j) of the IP Regulation.

For the 2022-23 financial year, all figures are reported based on the actual compliant applications processed by individual RTI and IP business units within State Government agencies, unless otherwise indicated in the tables.

### Disciplinary action

For the 2022-23 financial year, Ministers and agencies advised no disciplinary action was taken against any officer in relation to the administration of the Acts under section 113 of the RTI Act or section 126 of the IP Act (section 8(h) of the RTI Regulation or section 6(h) of the IP Regulation).

### Proceedings brought for offences

For the 2022-23 financial year, Ministers and agencies advised no proceedings were brought for offences under section 175(1) or (3) of the RTI Act or section 184(1) or (3) of the IP Act (section 8(i) of the RTI Regulation and section 6(i) of the IP Regulation).

### Relevant facts indicating efforts by agencies or Ministers to further the objects of the RTI Act and IP Act (section 8(k) of the RTI Regulation and section 6(k) of the IP Regulation)

[Appendix 25](#) summarises the efforts made by Ministers and agencies during the 2022-23 reporting period, which build on efforts made in previous years.

Several agencies participated in International Access to Information (IAI) Day, celebrated on 28 September each year. The theme for IAI Day 2022 was '*Artificial intelligence, e-governance and access to information*'. Agencies were encouraged to review their systems, policies and business practices and reaffirm their commitment to improving access to information.

This year Privacy Awareness Week (PAW) was held from 1 to 7 May 2023 and the theme was '*Privacy 101: Back to Basics*'. This annual event raised awareness within the public sector and the broader community about the importance of protecting and respecting personal information. Several agencies participated in PAW 2023 by organising promotional activities, leading up to and during PAW, which will continue to develop the privacy culture and foster good privacy practices.

## Machinery of Government (moG) changes

Three Administrative Arrangements Orders and one Administrative Arrangements Amendment Order made by the Governor in Council applied to this reporting period, namely:

- Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 1) 2023 (*made by the Governor in Council on 18 May 2023*);
- Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 1) 2022 (*made by the Governor in Council on 12 December 2022*);
- Administrative Arrangements Amendment Order (No. 3) 2021 (*made by the Governor in Council on 9 December 2021*); and
- Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 2) 2021 (*made by the Governor in Council on 7 October 2021*).

## Noncompliant access applications

If an application fails to comply with the requirements under the legislation, even after consultation with the applicant, a Prescribed Written Notice of the decision is sent under section 33 of the RTI Act or section 53 of the IP Act – *Noncompliance with application requirement*. This allows the applicant rights of review.

Noncompliant applications are not included in this report, except when the application was subject to an internal or external review.

## Deemed decisions

This financial year, the Office of the Information Commissioner (OIC) issued a significant decision<sup>1</sup> concluding that non-compliant applications require a considered decision by the end of the processing period (due date) to avoid a [deemed decision](#). This resulted in an increased number of deemed decisions being brought to OIC on external review in the latter months of 2022. Statistics for deemed decisions are detailed in Table 5 for each agency appendix.

## State Government agencies – overviews and comparisons

Detailed information for each agency is presented in Appendices 1 - 24 and summarised in the tables and figures below. The information reported is based on the actual compliant applications processed by individual RTI and IP business units within State Government agencies.

**Table 1** presents summary information about 2022-23 activity by agency.

It shows:

- the total number of compliant RTI access and IP access and amendment applications received as 16,883, a decrease from 16,979 applications in 2021-22;
- the total number of pages considered was 3,609,979 representing a 1.9 percent increase from 3,541,730 in 2021-22;
- internal reviews of 324 compared with 283 for 2021-22;
- external reviews of 572 compared with 561 for 2021-22; and
- total fees and charges received of \$634,561 compared with \$624,710 in 2021-22.

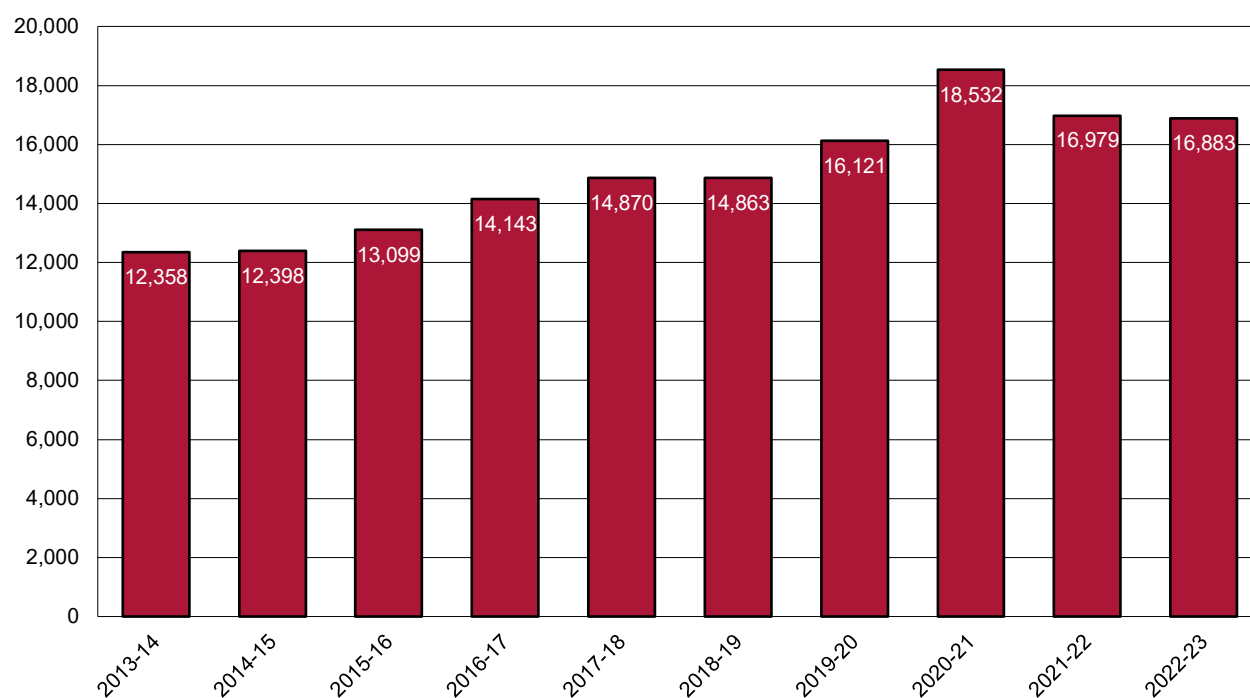

**Figure 1** shows the total number of compliant RTI access and IP access and amendment applications received over the last ten years by State Government agencies. These applications have decreased between 2021-22 (16,979) and 2022-23 (16,883). These figures include both compliant applications for information (access applications) and compliant applications to have personal information amended on the basis it is inaccurate, incomplete, out of date or misleading (amendment applications).

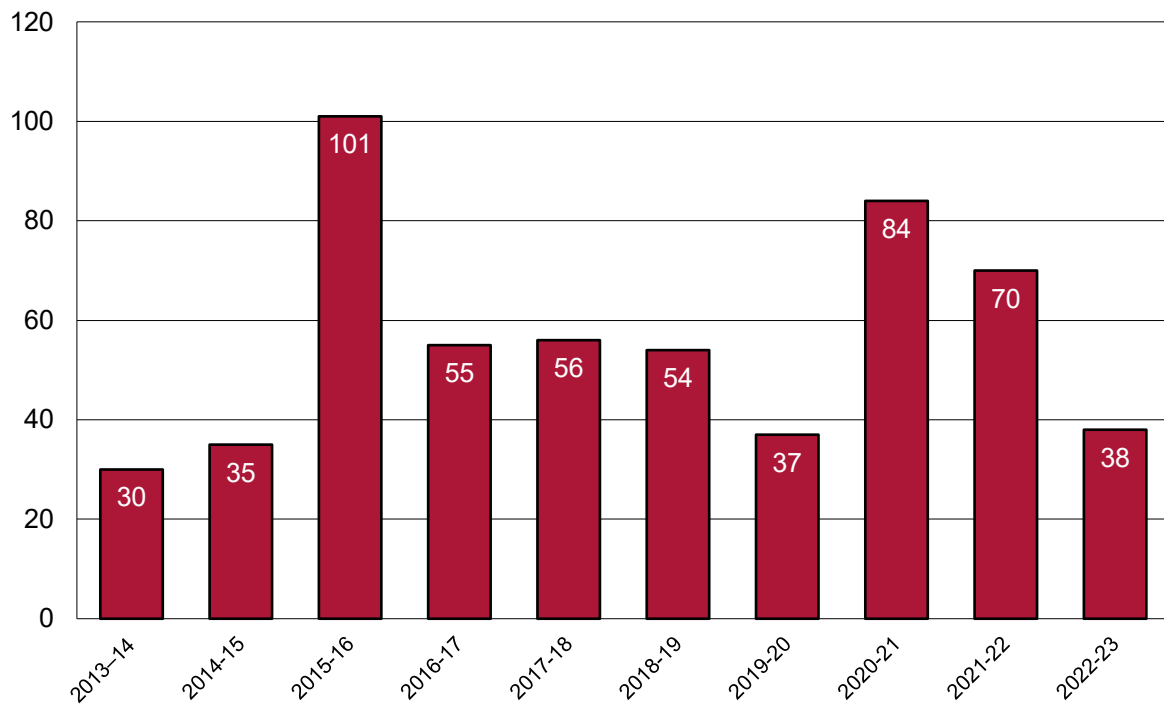

    - (i) *the number of deemed decisions under section 46 of the Act; and*
    - (ii) *the number of decisions on internal review taken to have been made under section 83(2) of the Act;*
  - (f) *for each agency or Minister—*

## ADDENDUM 2 – Notes about Appendices 1 to 24

### Deletion where no data returned

Where an agency has submitted a 'nil return' the line has been deleted from the table.

### Recording refusal of access – section 8(c) RTI Regulation and section 6(c) IP Regulation

Section 47(3)(a) of the RTI Act provides that access to a document may be refused to the extent the document comprises exempt information under section 48. Section 48(4) of the RTI Act defines **exempt information** as information that is exempt information under schedule 3. Refusals of access to exempt information are recorded in the Annual Report as the specific Schedule 3 exemption, for example 'sch3(7)' which is the exemption where *information is exempt information if it would be privileged from production in a legal proceeding on the ground of legal professional privilege.*

Section 47(3)(b) provides that access to a document may be refused to the extent the document comprises information the disclosure of which would be contrary to the public interest under section 49. Schedule 4 then sets out the factors for deciding the public interest.

Refusals of access to 'contrary to the public interest' information may therefore be recorded in the Annual Report as either 's.49-sch4' or the specific Schedule 4 factor for non-disclosure, for example 'sch4(3)(3)' which is the factor for non-disclosure where *disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy.*

## ADDENDUM 4 – Glossary of terms

<b>Access application</b>	An application for information made under Chapter 3 of the RTI Act or Chapter 3 of the IP Act.
<b>Access charge</b>	Charges prescribed under a regulation and payable for being given access to documents. In the reporting period, for example, black and white photocopying charges were 25 cents for each A4 page.
<b>Amendment application</b>	An application made under section 44 of the IP Act to have personal information amended on the basis that it is inaccurate, incomplete, out of date or misleading.
<b>Application fee</b>	The fee prescribed in the RTI Regulation and payable for an access application under the RTI Act. In line with the <i>Acts Interpretation (Fee Unit) Amendment Regulation 2023</i> , the RTI Act's application fee increased on 1 July 2022 to \$53.90 – applicable for the reporting period 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023.
<b>Deemed decision</b>	Refusing access to documents requested in an application.
<b>Decision taken to have been made on Internal Review</b>	A decision taken to have been made affirming the original decision.
<b>Disclosure Log</b>	Disclosure logs form part of the “push” model where information released under an RTI application is made available for access to the public by being published on agency websites. They provide access to information already released under the RTI application process. They can provide a cost and time benefit to both the individual and agency by reducing the number of additional applications under the RTI Act for the same information.
<b>Internal review</b>	An internal review is a decision within an agency made by a person who is no less senior than the original decision maker.
<b>External review</b>	An external review is a review undertaken by the Information Commissioner of a decision made by an agency or Minister.
<b>Processing charge</b>	Charges prescribed in the RTI Regulation for searching for, or retrieving a document, and making, or doing things related to making, a decision on an application. In general, processing charges are payable for RTI Act applications where an agency or Minister spends more than five hours processing non-personal documents. In line with the <i>Acts Interpretation (Fee Unit) Amendment Regulation 2023</i> , the RTI Act's processing charge increased on 1 July 2022 to \$8.35 for each 15 minutes or part thereof – applicable for the reporting period 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023.
<b>Portfolio/agencies</b>	Portfolio/agencies within a Minister's administrative responsibility are reported on under the relevant department's heading. For example, the Justice and Attorney-General portfolio includes DJAG and the Attorney-General and Minister for Justice and Minister for the Prevention of Domestic and Family Violence, as well as agencies such as Legal Services Commission and Electoral Commission of Queensland, all of which are reported under the DJAG heading.
<b>Publication Scheme</b>	A publication scheme is a structured list of an agency's information that is readily available to the public, free of charge wherever possible. Every government agency which is subject to the RTI Act must have a publication scheme.
<b>State Government agencies</b>	Includes departments, Ministers, portfolio agencies, statutory authorities, local governments and hospital and health services.
