

Report on subordinate legislation tabled between 25 June 2025 and 26 August 2025

Local Government, Small Business and Customer Service Committee



#### Overview

This report summarises the committee's findings following its examination of the subordinate legislation within its portfolio areas tabled between 25 June 2025 and 26 August 2025. It reports on any issues identified by the committee relating to the policy to be given effect by the legislation, fundamental legislative principles and lawfulness. It also reports on the compliance of the explanatory notes with the *Legislative Standards Act* 1992 (LSA).<sup>1</sup>

The report also notes any issues identified by the committee in its consideration of compliance with the *Human Rights Act 2019* (HRA)<sup>2</sup> and the human rights certificates tabled with the subordinate legislation.<sup>3</sup>

## Committee consideration of the subordinate legislation

#### **Committee Comment**



The committee did not identify any issues regarding the policy, consistency with fundamental legislative principles, the lawfulness of the subordinate legislation or non-compliance with the HRA.

Similarly, the committee considers that the explanatory notes tabled with the subordinate legislation noted in this report comply with the requirements of section 24 of the LSA, which includes advice about consultation, and that the human rights certificates tabled with the subordinate legislation provide a sufficient level of information to facilitate understanding of the subordinate legislation in relation to their compatibility with the HRA.

### 1 SL No. 64 of 2025 - Water Amendment Regulation 2025

The Water Amendment Regulation 2025 (SL No. 64) amends the Water Regulation 2016 to:

- prescribe 2 businesses (Elanda Point Pty Ltd and Tangalooma Island Resort Pty Ltd) as prescribed entities to allow them to hold a water licence that is not attached to land, ensuring continued lawful access to water for their operations<sup>4</sup>
- modernise public notification requirements for water allocation dealing applications by allowing the chief executive to publish the notice directly on a Queensland Government website<sup>5</sup>
- make technical amendments (including updating references and correcting minor errors relating to measurements).6

#### 2 SL No. 95 - Water Plan (Pioneer Valley) (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2025

Under the *Water Act 2000*, the Minister may postpone the expiry of a water plan from time to time for periods up to 3 years if the Minister is preparing a replacement water plan.<sup>7</sup>

To postpone the expiry of a water plan, the Minister must publish a notice of the new expiry date in the Queensland Government Gazette.<sup>8</sup> Such a notice is subordinate legislation.<sup>9</sup>

The Water Plan (Pioneer Valley) (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2025 (SL No. 95) postpones the expiry of the Water Plan (Pioneer Valley) 2002 to 30 April 2027.

The current process requires the chief executive to provide the applicant for a water allocation dealing with a notice that states the period and the way the information must be published. According to the explanatory notes, the amendments 'will streamline the process for the applicant and align with the process for public notification of a water licence dealing under the *Water Act 2000.*' SL No. 64; explanatory notes, p 1. The Water Plan (Pioneer Valley) 2002 was originally due to expire on 1 September 2013, but its expiry was previously postponed (in 2014, to 20 December 2022 and in 2022, to 30 September 2025).<sup>10</sup>

The explanatory notes state that the postponement in SL No. 95:

... will ensure that the effect of the water plan continues the existing water management framework, which in turn protects the existing water entitlements and the needs of the environment until a replacement plan comes into effect.<sup>11</sup>

### 3 SL No. 96 - Water Plan (Fitzroy Basin) (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2025

As noted above, under the *Water Act 2000*, the Minister may postpone the expiry of a water plan from time to time for periods up to 3 years if the Minister is preparing a replacement water plan.<sup>12</sup>

To postpone the expiry of a water plan, the Minister must publish a notice of the new expiry date in the Queensland Government Gazette. 13 Such a notice is subordinate legislation. 14

The Water Plan (Fitzroy Basin) (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2025 (SL No. 96) postpones the expiry of the Water Plan (Fitzroy Basin) 2011 to 30 June 2028.

The Water Plan (Fitzroy Basin) 2011 was originally due to expire on 1 September 2022, but its expiry was previously postponed (in 2022, to 30 August 2025). 15

The explanatory notes state that the postponement in SL No. 96:

... will ensure that the effect of the water plan continues the existing water management framework, which in turn protects the existing water entitlements and the needs of the environment until a replacement plan comes into effect. <sup>16</sup>

#### 4 SL No. 97 - Water Plan (Burdekin Basin) (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2025

As noted above, under the *Water Act 2000*, the Minister may postpone the expiry of a water plan from time to time for periods up to 3 years if the Minister is preparing a replacement water plan.<sup>17</sup>

Section 53 of the *Water Act 2000* provides that a water plan expires on 1 September first occurring after the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the day it was approved by the Governor in Council unless it is sooner repealed or the Minister postpones the expiry. See also *Water Act 2000*, ss 55, 56; Water Resource (Pioneer Valley) Plan (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2014 and Water Plan (Pioneer Valley) (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2022.

To postpone the expiry of a water plan, the Minister must publish a notice of the new expiry date in the Queensland Government Gazette. 18 Such a notice is subordinate legislation. 19

The Water Plan (Burdekin Basin) (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2025 (SL No. 97) postpones the expiry of the Water Plan (Burdekin Basin) 2007 to 31 March 2028.

The Water Plan (Burdekin Basin) 2007 was originally due to expire on 1 September 2017, but its expiry was previously postponed (in 2017, to 1 September 2019, in 2019, to 1 September 2023 and in 2023, to 1 September 2026).<sup>20</sup>

The explanatory notes state that the postponement in SL No. 97:

... will ensure that the effect of the water plan continues the existing water management framework, which in turn protects the existing water entitlements and the needs of the environment until a replacement plan comes into effect.<sup>21</sup>

# 5 SL No. 98 - Water Resource (Whitsunday) Plan (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2025

As noted above, under the *Water Act 2000*, the Minister may postpone the expiry of a water plan from time to time for periods up to 3 years if the Minister is preparing a replacement water plan.<sup>22</sup>

To postpone the expiry of a water plan, the Minister must publish a notice of the new expiry date in the Queensland Government Gazette.<sup>23</sup> Such a notice is subordinate legislation.<sup>24</sup>

The Water Resource (Whitsunday) Plan (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2025 (SL No. 98) postpones the expiry of the Water Resource (Whitsunday) Plan 2010 to 30 September 2028.

The Water Resource (Whitsunday) Plan 2010 was originally due to expire on 1 September 2020, but its expiry was previously postponed (in 2020, to 1 December 2025).<sup>25</sup>

Section 53 of the *Water Act 2000* provides that a water plan expires on 1 September first occurring after the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the day it was approved by the Governor in Council unless it is sooner repealed or the Minister postpones the expiry. See also *Water Act 2000*, ss 54, 55, 56; Water Plan (Burdekin Basin—Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2017; Water Plan (Burdekin Basin) (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2019; Water Plan (Burdekin Basin) (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2023.

To postpone the expiry of a water plan, the Minister must publish a notice of the new expiry date in the Queensland Government Gazette.<sup>28</sup> Such a notice is subordinate legislation.<sup>29</sup>

The Water Plan (Calliope River Basin) (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2025 (SL No. 99) postpones the expiry of the Water Plan (Calliope River Basin) 2006 to 30 June 2028.

The Water Plan (Calliope River Basin) 2006 was originally due to expire on 1 September 2017, but its expiry was previously postponed (in 2017, to 14 December 2026).<sup>30</sup>

The explanatory notes state that the postponement in SL No. 98:

... will ensure that the effect of the water plan continues the existing water management framework, which in turn protects the existing water entitlements and the needs of the environment until a replacement plan comes into effect.<sup>31</sup>

# 7 SL No. 100 - Water Plan (Boyne River Basin) (Postponement of Expiry) Notice 2025

As noted above, under the *Water Act 2000*, the Minister may postpone the expiry of a water plan from time to time for periods up to 3 years if the Minister is preparing a replacement water plan.<sup>32</sup>

To postpone the expiry of a water plan, the Minister must publish a notice of the new expiry date in the Queensland Government Gazette.<sup>33</sup> Such a notice is subordinate legislation.<sup>34</sup>
