Thank you for your letter of 13 November 2008 concerning petition number 1152-08, lodged by Mr Sam Watson.

With respect to the request to hold a commission of inquiry into the death of Mr Mulrunjie Doomadgee it is my understanding that there have been numerous commissions and tribunals that have investigated the issues surrounding the death of Indigenous persons in custody, in particular the 1990 Royal Commission into Aboriginal Deaths in Custody. There have been numerous recommendations made by the various bodies to address the issues surrounding the over-representation of Indigenous persons in our legal system and I do not consider that a further inquiry would be beneficial at this time. This government is committed to addressing these issues and has implemented a range of measures such as the Alcohol Management Plan, Community Justice Groups and the Murri Court.

In relation to the part of the petition about public funding for an appeal, Legal aid funding is available to appeal a conviction or sentence where a person meets Legal Aid Queensland's (LAQ) means test and merit test. A person seeking legal aid needs to submit a completed application form to LAQ. Legal aid funding is not available to assist or represent a person seeking a pardon.

In order for any person convicted of an offence to be pardoned, they must petition the Governor. A pardon petition does not have to be legally drafted. A clear recitation of the facts and supporting evidence is perfectly adequate. Should those convicted of offences relating to the Palm Island riots wish to petition the Governor for a pardon, Her Excellency's contact details are:
