Thank you for your letter dated 1 November 2012 enclosing petition number 2001-12. This petition, presented by Mr Sam Cox MP, Member for Thuringowa, on behalf of the principal petitioner Naomi Van der Starre, was received by the House on 31 October 2012. It draws the attention of the House to '*neighbours surveillance camera recording in other people's private back yards*' and requests that the House review all laws on '*what is personal surveillance or spying on your neighbour.*'

The Newman Government's priorities are to deliver on its election commitments and six month action plan for the period July to December 2012. There are currently no plans to review laws on personal surveillance or spying on neighbours. I note however that section 48A(3) of the *Invasion of Privacy Act 1971* provides an offence if a person is found in a house or yard of another person without a reasonable excuse. The offence has a maximum penalty of 20 penalty units (currently \$2200), or one year's imprisonment.

In addition, Dispute Resolution Centres provide a way of settling disputes, including disputes between neighbours. Trained mediators help parties to a dispute to reach an agreement. This process is successful in resolving a wide range of disputes speedily and inexpensively.
