#### 11.13 Application of ss 10.5 and 10.6 to acts and omissions before commencement

- (1)If, immediately before the commencement, 11 previous sections 10.5 and 10.6 applied to a tort 12 committed, act done or omission made by an 13 officer, staff member, recruit or volunteer before 14 the commencement, those provisions as in force 15 at the time the tort was committed, act was done 16 or omission was made continue to apply in 17 relation to the tort, act or omission. 18
- (2) If an officer, staff member, recruit or volunteer 19 engaged in conduct in an official capacity after 20 the commencement and the conduct is part of a 21 course of conduct that also includes torts 22 committed, acts done or omissions made before 23 the commencement, new section 10.5 applies to 24 all the conduct forming the course of conduct. 25
