Dear Mr Laurie <sup>Neil</sup>

I refer to your correspondence of 9 March 2026 regarding Petition 4283-25 received by the Queensland Legislative Assembly on 3 March 2026.

I appreciate the petitioners' concerns regarding taking action to reduce hooning in Mansfield and surrounding suburbs and referred this matter to the Queensland Police Service (QPS) so that I can be better informed about the issues raised.

The Crisafulli Government is keeping Queensland road users safe through a \$2 million commitment for a network of anti-hooning cameras to be delivered across Rochedale South, Springwood, Daisy Hill, Shailer Park, Mount Cotton, Sheldon and Priestdale.

I am advised officers from the Upper Mt Gravatt Highway Patrol attended Morialta Street, Mansfield, on 12 March to conduct proactive enforcement and gain a further understanding of the issues raised. In collaboration with other policing units, the Highway Patrol Unit will ensure targeted enforcement continues to be carried out in the area.

The QPS relies upon the assistance of local residents to identify and address local concerns and to this end encourages members of the public to provide local police with details of criminal and anti-social behaviour. Where there is sufficient evidence of an offence, appropriate enforcement action will be taken by police.

Dangerous or unsafe road use behaviour can be reported to the QPS via Policelink on telephone 131 444, to the Hoon Hotline on 13HOON (134 666) or by submitting an online report using the link <https://forms.police.qld.gov.au/launch/Hooning>. The Hoon Hotline is available 24 hours a day in order to enable people to report any type of dangerous or unsafe road use behaviour. All reports received via the Hoon Hotline are assigned to police officers for investigation.

I thank the petitioners for bringing their concerns to the attention of the House.
