People of Parliament: Premier

The Premier is the leader of the party that holds a <u>majority</u> number of seats in the Queensland							
Parliament. Consequently, the Premier is the <u>political</u> leader of Queensland. The role of Premier used to							
be a ' <u>convention</u> '. This means it was not an official role but rather, the result of <u>tradition</u> . However,							
since 2001, the role of Premier is now an official position, recorded in Queensland's <u>Constitution</u> .							
When people vote in an <u>election</u> , they don't directly choose a candidate to be Premier. Instead, they							
vote for the candidate they want to represent their <u>electorate</u> in parliament. The person with the most							
<u>votes</u> in each electorate gets their own seat in the Legislative Assembly, becoming the Member of							
Parliament representing that electorate.							
After an election, the party with the support of the majority of <u>seats</u> in the Legislative <u>Assembly</u> , is							
asked to form a government. The leader of the majority party is sworn in as Premier by the Governor (11)							
The Premier gets their authority from their $\underline{\text{party}}_{(12)}$, as its leader. If the party decides to elect a new							
<u>leader</u> , the convention is that the incumbent Premier <u>resign</u> . The new party leader is then sworn in							
as Premier. Once the Premier takes office, they select ministers from the <u>Legislative</u> Assembly to form							
a Cabinet. Each Cabinet Minister is allocated a <u>portfolio</u> or area of responsibility. These ministers are							
then also <u>sworn</u> in by the Governor.							
The <u>Cabinet</u> , made up of Premier and ministers, comprises the <u>Executive</u> branch of government,							
which is responsible for putting laws and policies into effect. As the Chief Executive, the Premier has							
many roles and responsibilities, including:							
- performing the role of leader of the $\frac{State}{(21)}$,							
- communicating the <u>decisions</u> of Cabinet to the Governor							
- advising the Governor to perform certain acts, like issuing the writs for an election, and							
- representing the <u>people</u> of their electorate, like any other <u>Member</u> of Parliament.
