Will the Minister advise (a) what community consultation, demand studies, cyclist and traffic counts were undertaken to justify the need for this section of Nerang Southport Road, (b) if the department undertook consultation with City of Gold Coast, the State Member, local schools or residents, (c) if any alternative options were considered and if there are any other plans for further bicycle lanes or re-alignment of sections of Nerang-Southport Road and (d) if there are any plans for or has there been any consideration given to footpath, improvements within the same corridor?

1180 **MR M BERKMAN** ASKED PREMIER AND MINISTER FOR TRADE (HON A PALASZCZUK)—

With reference to the Premier's statement on 20 August 2019: 'The Police Commissioner showed me evidence of locking devices that are laced with traps which are dangerous. These protesters put their arms into steel cylinders and drums filled with concrete. Inside these cylinders and drums are glass fragments—even butane gas containers—so that anyone trying to cut a protester free will be injured or worse'—

Will the Premier advise (a) how many examples of such devices has the Premier been made aware of, (b) the dates and locations of any incidents in which such devices have been used, (c) including and in addition to the use of glass and butane, in what way was each of these devices respectively designed to harm or endanger emergency services personnel and (d) of any examples of emergency services personnel being injured – 'or worse' – by such devices?
